

Opportunities to Connect

The Center for Student Involvement (CSI) supports more than 40 clubs and organizations that allow you to create a sense of community for yourself and others.

Here are just a few examples: Black Artists and Designers (BAAD) works to educate, inform and promote blackness and it's intersections both on and off campus; the Korean Student Association (KSA) brings cultural diversity to campus through the Korean Culture Show, food nights, movie nights, and more; the Leadership and Community Engagement (LACE) program offers

opportunities to work with local non-profit organizations and help keep local communities connected to RISD; the RISD Feminists club spreads awareness about women's issues, areas of intersectionality, and social justice.
